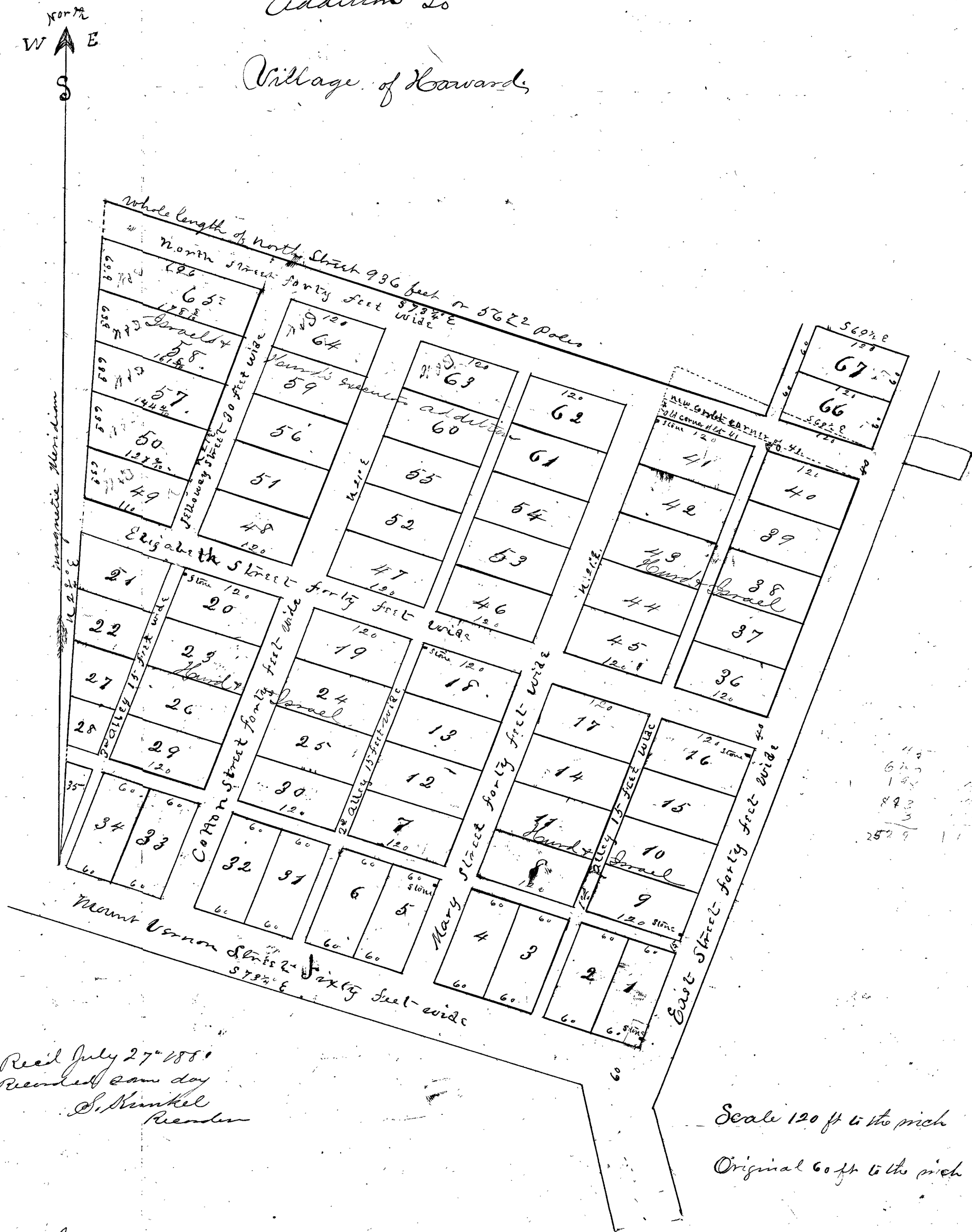

Addition To

Village of Howard,



I certify that addition to the Village of Howard in Knox County Ohio, including lots numbered from 46 to 67 inclusive was surveyed by me on the 10th day of June 1881, and is in the S.W. part of lot 3, in the 4th qr. of Township 7, in Range 11; that the courses of lines are laid down on the plat, the lines are intended to be parallel and lots are 60 by 120 feet, or the length of lines are placed on the plat. Day stones on lots 18, 20 & 41 are used for this addition. They are 2 feet from the line of the lots,

on which they stand, the dotted lines affecting lots 40+66+41 represent a change in that part of North street lying between said lots by throwing the west corner of 41 to the S.W. of 66, 22 links to the North as represented by the dotted lines. Done at the request of Mr. S. Israel, and plotting in connection with the former additions also at his request.
