The Delaware, Knox, Marion, Morrow (DKMM) Solid Waste District is a legal political subdivision of the State of Ohio and is funded by a \$6.00 per ton fee on municipal solid waste generated within the District.

The District's Board of Directors consists of twelve county commissioners from its four county members. The Board is charged with implementing the District's Solid Waste Management Plan.

DKMM funds programs providing educational outreach and prctical alternatives to disposal of generated wastes. These programs include recycling, composting, and solid waste enforcement and monitoring, as well as household hazardous waste, electronics, and tire collections. DKMM also provides grant funding to both private and public-sector entities to implement and improve effective waste management programs.

SEPARATION & HANDLING OF MATERIALS FOR RECYCLING

All recyclable materials can be placed together into one container at any drop-off location throughout Knox County.

None of the above items require lid removal.

Under no circumstances will any other types of items such as hazardous materials, trash, toys, furniture, tires, etc. be permitted to be left at the recycling sites. To do so is a violation of Ohio State Litter Law Revised Code 3767.32. Fines up to \$500 and sentences up to 60 days in jail could be served to anyone who decides to leave miscellaneous items other than residential recyclables at the sites. All violators will be prosecuted.

SPECIAL COLLECTION EVENTS

DKMM offers several special collection events every year for residents of Delaware, Knox, Marion, and Morrow Counties. No businesses, governments, or institutions are permitted. Must have proof of residency (driver's license or utility bill). Containers will not be returned.

Call (740) 393-4600 to schedule your appointment.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Adhesives: roof tar and driveway sealers
- Automotive fluids: antifreeze, motor oil, gasoline, brake fluid, etc.
- Batteries: alkaline, Ni-Cad, lithium, rechargeable, lead acid (all batteries must have ends taped)
- Fire extinguishers
- Fluorescent bulbs
- **Household chemicals:** pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, insecticides, etc.
- Mercury & mercury containing items
- Paint and paint related materials: aerosol, latex, oil-based paint, varnish, sealers, primers, thinners, turpentine, stains, etc. (Non-dried paint is accepted)
- Propane cylinders: 20 lbs. and under
- Smoke alarms: only if it contains a radioactive symbol


\$1.00/lb. (minimum \$5.00 disposal fee) Limit 10 cans latex paint - 5 gallon containers & under - no empty containers

PROPER PAINT DISPOSAL

Paint can be air dried by putting it into a box or bag and adding kitty litter, shredded newspaper, or a product called Floor Dry. Some home improvement stores sell an inexpensive paint hardener. Once the paint is in a solid form, you can dispose of it in your regular trash by leaving the lid off of the can. Never air dry paint near children or pets.









RECYCLING OF PLASTIC BAGS, FILM, AND WRAP

RECYCLABLE

- Retail, carryout, produce, newspaper, bread, and dry cleaning bags (clean, dry, and free of receipts and hangers)
- Ziploc-style food storage bags (clean and dry)
- Plastic shipping envelopes such as medicine bags (remove labels)
- Bubble wrap and air pillows (deflated)
- Product wrap on cases of water or soda bottles, paper towels, napkins, disposable cups, bathroom tissue, diapers, and feminine sanitary products
- Furniture and electronic wrap
- Plastic cereal box liners (if it tears like paper, do not include)
- Any film packaging or bag that has the How2Recycle label

NOT RECYCLABLE

- Degradable or compostable bags or film packaging
- Pre-washed salad mix bags
- Frozen food bags

- · Candy bar wrappers
- · Chip bags
- Six-pack rings

Many of these bags may contain a barrier polymer that protects the food and extends shelf life. This is considered a contaminant in this type of recycling.





COMPOSTING

Backyard composting conserves water, reduces reliance on fertilizers, and saves landfill space. With little expense and effort, you can compost food, yard, and paper wastes, as well as some animal manure. Be sure to exclude cat and dog waste if compost will be used on vegetable plants. Below are the basic needs of a compost pile. For more detailed information on backyard composting, visit dkmm.org.

- Size of Pile
 A 3' x 3' x 3' pile is ideal. This is large enough to hold heat, but small enough to circulate air through the center of the pile.
- Temperature
 Keeping the pile at 90°F-140°F ensures quick decomposition.
- Water
 Not too much and not too little. Your pile should feel like a lightly dampened sponge.
- Turning your pile regularly will assist the decomposition process and reduce odors.
- Organic Matter

 The proper balance of greens and browns will result in faster decomposition, decreasing the wait time before you can use your compost.

All materials must be loaded/unloaded by hand.

KNOX COUNTY - TRANSFER STATION

A transfer station is a building or processing site for the temporary deposition of waste. Transfer stations are often where local waste collection vehicles will deposit their cargo prior to loading it into larger vehicles. Residents may also use transfer stations to dispose of items such as couches, lamps, rugs, mattresses, and certain construction debris too big for local haulers. Minimum fees may apply.
